HOW IT STARTED?

Donna and Sam Cooper travelled to Cambodia in 2006, hoping to spend a couple of weeks helping out an orphanage, as so many other volunteer - tourists do.

They fell in love with the country and the people, but were horrified by some of the orphanages and other aid organisations that were working there.

They decided to start their own foundation and run it the right way. The entire Cooper family jumped on board, and with the help of the Woodend community, they started raising funds to build all of the amazing projects that exist today.

WHAT ARE WE TRYING TO DO?

Purpose: Empower, enable & educate Cambodian communities with the opportunity and a new perspective so they can fundamentally change their own lives

There are many issues that need to be corrected for Cambodia to become a better place. There is a general lack of education, poor health and low income. This comes from poor schools, hospitals and infrastructure in general, which in turn is caused by poor government. As you follow the problem up to the highest level, it becomes evident that we need to attack the problem at the source by creating better leaders.

The way we see it, there is only one way to tackle this unique problem. First, we help the locals to raise their children with good values, show them the issues that their country is facing and encourage them to strive to make a difference in their world. Make it clear to them that they are capable of making a change to their own country.

Next we give them all the tools they need to achieve great things. We support our students through school and university until they are able to reach those positions

where they can make a big impact. Whatever they choose to do and wherever they choose to go, they'll still be doing good things at a community or family level because they believe in the idea that it is everyone's responsibility to improve our world. And they will have the ability to create a better life for themselves because the education they have earned will have opened up more opportunities.

All we want is for more good people to have more opportunities to do something good.

WHAT MAKES US DIFFERENT?

There are a thousand and one reasons that make CKF stand out from the rest, but they usually come back to one key factor – that everyone involved is a 100% volunteer.

There are plenty of ways that CKF stand out from the rest, but we love to share to one key point of difference – all our board members are 100% volunteer. Why is that significant? It means that none of the decision-makers within our organisation have a vested interest or agenda, except the common love for the people of Cambodia and the desire to make a difference in their lives.

You can trust CKF because all we care about is helping the children. If we didn't, we wouldn't be here. Sometimes NGOs with a large paid cohort tend to work slowly and create new projects by over-complicating things. The sad truth is, poverty has become an industry, and many of those who are working to end it, are also

relying on it as their main source of income. They might never end poverty because nobody is truly willing to work themselves out of a job.

In late 2019 CKF employed its first ever paid employee in an administration and marketing role. The money to fund this role was contributed by corporate sponsor Zinc, so 100% of all sponsor donations are still contributed directly to Cambodia, as they always have and always will! The Marketing & Administration role has provided significant support to our voluntary board and many goals have been achieved, and continue to be achieved.

WHERE ARE WE?

All of our projects are based in Cambodia - Predominantly in Soksan Village in Kampong Thom province and in the capital city Phnom Penh. We also have smaller projects in other provinces, but these are generally not ongoing.

Whilst our hearts are in Cambodia, CKF's home is in Australia. Woodend, and the Macedon Ranges, is where CKF began, and it is where 90% of our support base, and much of our funding, comes from.

CKF is a deeply ingrained part of the Macedon Ranges community and we are very grateful for their help. We now have a growing support base in Australia outside the Macedon Ranges, and globally we have supporters in the USA, Germany, Canada and Singapore, amongst other places.





WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Soksan International School (SIS)

Our major project, SIS, has over 250 students studying 5 days a week. Our curriculum is Inquiry-based, which means it's student directed, depending on what they are interested in and what they want to learn about. We also have an ever-growing range of electives, such as: IT, Dance, Music, Media, Phys. Ed., Cooking, Tournament of Minds, Photography, Art, Textiles and more.

We are giving our students not just a place to learn, but the skills they will need to continue their learning throughout life – Computer and Internet skills, research and reading ability, critical thinking, healthy skepticism, etc

Above all, we believe that it is important to instill good values in our students. Compassion, respect, community-mindedness and persistence are among our core values.

Medical Program

Our small medical centre in Soksan Village provides basic medical care to over 300 people who would otherwise simply go without. We treat what we can, and for more serious problems, we take the patients to hospitals/clinics and cover all of the costs. We have people who are now being treated for TB, Epilepsy and HIV, who were previously not receiving any treatment at all. The bottom line is, there are dozens of people alive today who otherwise would not be.

Women's Health

CKF has developed partnerships with local hospitals and NGO's to provide high quality medical treatment to hundreds of women. We also provide monthly women's health sessions and cover important topics such as: contraception, personal hygiene, STIs and more. We also provide clean underwear and sanitary pads to all women in our local community.



Soksan International School

Soksan International School (SIS) is one of the largest employers in the Thnal Bek Community, employing over 41 staff. We have 11 teachers & admin staff, 8 teacher aids, 8 baby carers, 8 cleaners & cooks and 6 drivers & security guards. All our staff are from Soksan Village ensuring continued sustainability and ethical employment for our local families.

Soksan Community Garden

Soksan Garden is now fully run by our school. It is a beautiful place for our classes to gather for their lessons, we also grow vegetables and teach lessons on horticulture, how to grow vegetables and sell them at the market and we use the vegetables to cook for our children every day. The garden also provides employment opportunities for 2-3 staff members.



ONE: Day Spa & Training Centre

An elegant day spa in the heart of Phnom Penh, ONE: Day Spa & Training Centre is one of CKF's income generation projects which was created to provide employment and training to young women so they can move on to gain employment or open their own businesses. ONE is a training facility plus an operational business serving locals, expats and tourists with beautiful massage and beauty treatments. All profits made by ONE are either invested back into itself, or are used to fund CKF projects.

FAMILY & EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

This is a broad project that doesn't really have any specific boundaries.

Where possible, we try to support the families of our students and staff and any other people we are involved with. This can include: building houses, interest-free micro loans, rescuing children from trafficking, helping out with funerals/weddings - Potentially anything that we need to do to make sure that our students are able to have the best opportunity for success.

A significant part of this program is our Soksan Village Safe House - A safe place for families or individuals in dangerous situations



OUR IMPACT

When our school first opened in Soksán Village, there had been 1 person in the village's history to have completed high school, and there were no children in the village studying higher than grade 6 at the time. Since then our school has helped increase that number to 7 high school graduates, with another 12 students on track to graduate in the next 2 years.

MY STORY: MR KHOEUN

In 1989, at the age of 27, I joined the army, where I fought with the Vietnamese Government soldiers during the war. I served, risking my life to win the war for 8 years. During the war, there were consequences such as lack of food, malnutrition, chronic illness, and some men were left with broken legs. Others died because of the mines, many people lost their families and are left to live with the memories that they can't forget.

After the war, I went to work in the fields at Pailin Province for money to support my family. While working in Pailin Province, I was walking through the fields and right away I just knew that I stepped on mine, the floor exploded under me. I was in hospital for 1 month, they amputated my foot while I was at Pailin Province, but I was not recovering as well as they would like, and I could not afford the treatment in Pailin Province, it was too expensive. My foot became rotten so I was sent to Battambang where they amputated more of my leg (up to the knee). I stayed in hospital for another 2 months. It has been 22 years since I lost my leg.

So far, I have had five children now, 4 girls and 1 boy. My eldest daughter is a teacher at Soksán School, my second daughter is in 11th grade, but now she is at home because Covid-19 is not able to go to school. My son is training as a monk and for my youngest two daughters, they are twins now they study in Soksán Kindergarten.

I am now a guard at Soksán International School. When I worked at this school, I felt happy because I was able to support my wife and my children. And the children studied and worked at Soksán International School every day.



SEW GOOD CASE STUDY



The Sew Good Company is a clothing company that provides women in rural Cambodia with fair, safe, family friendly employment. Sew Good work with women to promote their rights and significance within the workplace with the aim to promote women as the leaders, change makers and role models that they are within their community and their family.

While mother/daughter team (and founders of CKF) Donna & Sam Cooper were in Cambodia working with the foundation, they saw and learned first hand the impacts of unfair and unsafe working conditions on the lives of Cambodian women. Through their existing Australian based stores and experience in retail, they saw an opportunity to provide a safe and positive workplace for the women who live in Soksan. In 2013, they started The Sew Good Company, they started small, stocking hand-made sock monkeys. Never imagining they would grow to be what they are today. A team of women with the skills, the support, the creativity and the product that sees proud women support proud women.

The Sew Good Company was founded through a desire to create a community-centred, ethical workplace where team members could earn a fair living, save and invest in opportunities and also feel free to take the time to care for their health, their wellbeing and their family. They practise and promote these values in their business in both Cambodia and Australia.

They are trying to change the way the garment industry works, not only in Cambodia, but worldwide. The Sew Good Company exists not only to offer employment, but also to educate consumers about the harsh realities of many garment factories. They aim to be a catalyst in the fashion industry by changing the way people perceive 'fast fashion'. Offering an alternative to unethical clothing and providing an answer to the question of, "Who made my clothing?"

The Sew Good Company currently employs 24 team members from Soksan Village, Kampong Thom, Cambodia. They provide living wages, free family medical care, free family education, free training programs and much more.

WHAT IS SPONSORSHIP ALL ABOUT?

CKF has a sponsorship program to help us cover the costs of our projects including our major project, Soksan International School. CKF is responsible for all the operational costs of the school including wages, electricity, school supplies, providing a school bus and driver, security guards, nutritional programs, hygiene programs, sporting programs, swimming programs, music and dance programs and so much more.

We have school sponsorships available at just \$50 per month. This is the average cost to CKF to provide a student with free education 5 days a week and full medical care and nutrition. We currently have approximately 250 students attending Soksan International School.

Our current level of funding caters for around 138 students, and our goal is to reach enough funding for the entire current enough funding for up to 300 students.

At CKF we pride ourselves on providing all of our beautiful children in Soksan Village with the same level of care, so we have chosen to focus on school sponsorship rather than child sponsorship. This will ensure that no child ever feels left out or uncared for if they do not have a sponsor. Our hope is to get enough sponsors on board to alleviate the pressure on our funding of the school and our other projects.

Sponsors receive regular contact through the foundation with updates from the school and the village. They can also follow our Facebook page where we post videos, pictures and updates from individual teachers, children and classes.

We also have project sponsorship available, which ranges from \$30 - \$500 p/m depending on the project.

Sponsorship covers a huge part of our monthly costs and is one of the keys to CKF's sustainability into the future. We are hoping to reach our target of 150 sponsors by the end of the year.

WHAT IS MISHCAM?

Mission: Cambodia (aka "MishCam") is CKF's very own hands-on volunteer trip. Just ask any past MishCammer and they will tell you it is one of the greatest experiences of their lives.

The trip brings serious hands-on volunteering together with a relaxing holiday and some sightseeing as you travel across Cambodia.

The trips are tailor-made depending on the group that is going and the skill base of the volunteers in each group. We do construction, medical assistance, teaching, training, designing, planning - Whatever it is you're good at, that's what you can help us with.

We have had school groups, team-building trips for businesses, schoolies groups and other groups that are open to public. We don't discriminate, anyone can join as long as they are good people and want to help Cambodia!

MishCam costs \$1500 per person for two weeks. This includes all ground costs (accommodation, food, transport, entry tix, etc) but doesn't include airfares to Cambodia. All MishCam volunteers must also fundraise at least \$1200 before joining the trip. This money goes toward the running of our projects, but also serves as a commitment from our volunteers that they are genuine and dedicated to helping the cause, and that's important to us.

GOALS RESULTS FOR 2020-2021

DEVELOP SIS CURRICULUM GOAL ACHIEVED

Our goal was to have a comprehensive and robust curriculum for each grade level, using our new school curriculum framework based on project-based learning, by the end of the year, which could be repeated and refined each year.

Our teaching team was able to successfully use the remote learning period to work intensively on our curriculum documentation. While our teaching and learning has continued to be affected by COVID, we look forward to in-person learning resuming soon so that we can truly see our new curriculum in practice and continue to refine and improve moving forward.

PROJECT REPORTING GOAL ACHIEVED

Our goal was to ensure regular reporting and updating including high quality video and photos are made available to our sponsors, supporters and volunteers.

We have successfully implemented monthly newsletter updates to our sponsors and supporters keeping them updated with events happening in the school and at Soskan Village. We have also successfully implemented a social media strategy around regular updates with lots of images from the school and the village and regular updates on activities from Cambodia too. We have redeveloped our website which is also regularly updated with current stories and information. Our project reporting will continue to be a high priority for the foundation to ensure that our sponsors, supporters and volunteers are consistently kept in the loop with our activities and helping demonstrate how their continued support helps the foundation continue to do our important and vital work Empowering the Future of Cambodia.

STAY CONNECTED: GETTING THERE

This year we made it an even bigger focus to stay more connected with our sponsors and supporters in Australia.

We now have someone dedicated to looking after our administration and who is helping us manage our sponsorship processes, look after our administration, write regular newsletter updates to our sponsors and supporters and also keep them updated via our Facebook pages.

GOALS FOR 2021-22

PROVIDE UNIFORMS FOR STAFF & CHILDREN EVERY YEAR

This year we would like to find a major sponsor or multiple sponsors to fund the provision of uniforms for all staff and children every year. The school uniforms are vital for the safety of our children & staff. The uniforms identify our children and staff as belonging to the Soskan Village community and protects them from being beaten by others outside the village, from being taken and exploited into the sex-trade industry, and many other truly unspeakable crimes that unfortunately occur regularly in Cambodia. To provide enough uniforms for every staff member and every child, the foundation needs to raise \$12,000 per year.

PROVIDE MORE FREE EDUCATION

Our goal at Soksan International School is to ensure that all children continue to feel valued, loved and cared for during these crazy Covid times. During times of school closure we aim to continue to provide free education to the children through providing homework packs for the children to collect each week. Our goal is to keep the children engaged and excited to return to school when we are allowed to commence school again.

PROVIDE MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR TRAINING

ONE: Day Spa & Training Centre has recently gone through a move to a smaller location with more affordable rent to ensure we can continue with this business during the tough times Covid-19 have presented us with. Our goal is to get the business running to a point where it is at least breaking even, and apply for some funding to help us train and educate more women in the beauty industry, helping empower them and give the opportunities to find employment in ethical workplaces providing beauty services such as hair, nails and massage.



OUR TEAM

MACEDON RANGES MUSIC FESTIVAL



Long time supporters of CKF the Macedon Ranges Music Festivals donate 100% of every ticket sale to CKF!

The 2021 Macedon Ranges Music Festival (MRMF) was a long awaited event that came after a horror 12 months for the music and events industry due to COVID-19. For the first time ever, MRMF was sold out weeks before the event which displayed the community's eagerness to get behind both the Cambodian Kids Foundation and local music industry. With headline acts The Black Sorrows, Emma Donovan & the Putbacks and Nick Barker, fans came from across Victoria to the Gisborne Steam Park.

While the day started with blue skies and sunshine, things quickly took a turn for the worse in the afternoon with heavy winds and rain moving into Gisborne along with a cold front that threatened the continuation of the day. While the poor weather couldn't stop fans from dancing and lapping up the live music, unfortunately the difficult decision was made to cancel the event halfway through due to safety concerns for the musicians on stage.

Although the cancellation was heart-breaking for the organisers, musicians and fans, the community's show of support was immense following the event. Over 90% of ticketholders chose to not request a refund in an effort raise as much money as possible for CKF. These efforts saw a record-breaking \$21,890 raised for CKF from the day which came at a most important time due to the challenges faced by CKF due to COVID-19.

The MRMF committee would like to extend it's thanks to major sponsors Gisborne & District Community Bendigo Bank and Macedon Ranges Shire Council as well as to the musicians, stallholders, SES crew and MRMF volunteers who make this event possible each and every year. The planning of MRMF2022 is well underway with some exciting announcements on their way!

FINANCIAL STUFF



We believe that our use of funding is as good as it could possibly be and we are very proud of that fact. The charts on the next few pages show our use of funds for the 2020/21 financial year.

92.4% of our overall funding is used directly on projects on the ground in Cambodia, which is an impressive figure. Our preference has always been to minimise overheads in Australia, so that we can ensure that as much of the money donated as possible gets used where it is really needed. Of our administrative expenses, the majority goes towards a 3% administration fee from Rotary Australia, our umbrella organisation. While our goal is always to ensure the lowest possible administration expenditure, our partnership with Rotary Australia is invaluable and enables us to offer tax-deductibility to our generous donors.

Of the remaining overhead costs, it is all covered by various donors who have chosen to have their donations cover specific expenses. For example, we have had donors who sponsor our bank fees, admin costs, stationery needs, etc.

This all means that when someone makes a donation to CKF, since all of our overhead costs have already been covered, 100% of their donation goes straight to operating our programs in Cambodia. This is true for sponsorship, one-off donations and other fundraising activities.
